

Interconnection Process

Small Power Production and Cogeneration under 100 KW

1. Comply with Cooperative's Tariff

Review FEC's Rules and Regulations regarding Small Power and Cogeneration Under 100 kW to make sure your system is in compliance.

2. Make Application and Provide Information

Download a copy of the Application for Interconnection, fill out requested information and attach supporting documents. Sign and return copy of application with supporting documents required by fax, mail or email to electric@fayette.coop.

3. Pay for Extension of Cooperative's Facilities (if required)

If extension of FEC's facilities is necessary to complete interconnection, member-owners will be required to comply with conditions of the FEC Line Extension Policy.

4. Review of Application and Supporting Documents

FEC will review the application and supporting documents to determine if more information is required and/or if any further studies will be needed before an Agreement of Interconnection is drafted.

5. Agreement and Proof of Insurance

The form of agreement for interconnection will be sent to the member-owner for review and signature. Return the signed agreement with proof of liability insurance to FEC.

6. Complete Construction

Construct the power generating installation and install a disconnect switch and other protective equipment.

7. Comply with Applicable Laws

It is the member-owner's responsibility to make sure their power generating installation complies with applicable federal, state and local laws, ordinances and regulations.

8. Notify Cooperative

Notify FEC in advance of energizing your generating installation and permit FEC to install any necessary metering and to review the protective equipment.

9. Eliminate Conditions Preventing Interconnection

FEC will review the protective equipment and in the event there are conditions preventing safe interconnection and proper parallel operation, FEC will notify the member-owner. The member-owner may not interconnect and/or initiate parallel operation until such conditions are corrected and written notification has been provided to FEC at least (10) days in advance of interconnection of parallel operation.

10. Approval

After the disconnect and safety features have been reviewed and approved, a representative of FEC will sign the Agreement of Interconnection and notify the member-owner of approval.
