# ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

The Annual Membership Meeting of Fayette Electric Cooperative, Inc. was held on July 17, 2024 at the KC Community Center in La Grange, Texas, County of Fayette, with registration beginning at 5:30 p.m. and the business meeting commencing at 7:00 p.m.

All the members of the Board of Directors were present, namely: David Lehmann, Joseph D. Kruppa, Bill Briscoe, David A. Stancik, Leo C. Henke, Gale Lincke, and James A. Anderle. Also present was Karen Mahoney-Woods, the Cooperative's attorney.

Members of the Fayette County 4-H clubs provided assorted cookies, lemonade, and coffee to the members attending the meeting. Several guests were also present with an approximate total attendance of 565.

President Lehmann called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m., and he stated the purpose of the meeting was to provide the board and management the opportunity to present an update on the activities of the Cooperative and to elect two directors to represent members in Districts 3 and 4. For safety purposes, he also indicated the locations of the exit signs in the event of an emergency.

After the invocation was presented by Director Joseph D. Kruppa, the members and their guests sang the National Anthem. Director James A. Anderle then led the Pledge of Allegiance and the Pledge to the Texas Flag.

President Lehmann then introduced the new General Manager Doug Lambert, who briefly introduced himself to the crowd. He then recognized the Fayette County 4-H Club members, leaders, and volunteers for their years of support and for providing and serving refreshments.

The Manager also recognized several guests: including State Representative Stan Kitzman; Tom Hancock with Garland Power & Light; John Spiess with San Bernard Electric Cooperative; Sherry Murphy with Bluebonnet Electric Cooperative; and Alyssa Meinke also with Bluebonnet Electric Cooperative, and he thanked them for attending. The Secretary then read the Official Notice of the Meeting followed by the Proof of Mailing, all being made a part of these minutes as Exhibits A & B.

The President then stated that the Secretary normally read the minutes of last year's annual meeting; however, in the interest of time, the President entertained a motion from the floor to dispense with the reading thereof. Upon motion by Linda M. Anders, seconded by Jimmy Carter, it was:

RESOLVED, That the membership waive the reading of the minutes of the July 19, 2023 annual meeting. Motion unanimously carried.

Before the initial prize drawing was held, President Lehmann announced that each member who registered for the annual meeting would receive a \$20 energy bill credit as an attendance prize. This is a \$10 increase over what was given last year. This amount, he said, would be automatically deducted from their next utility bill.

Next, the President announced that there would be a drawing for attendance door prizes. Director David A. Stancik drew the names of 20 door prize winners.

The President then asked FEC Attorney Karen Mahoney-Woods to report the names of those officially nominated at the District 3 and 4 meetings which were held in May and to conduct the election of the two directors.

Attorney Woods then proceeded with the election of directors. She stated that the District 3 meeting was held on May 6, 2024, and that Gale Lincke was the only candidate nominated, and upon a voice vote, she received a unanimous vote of those present and voting and was thereupon declared to be the sole nominee for director of District 3. She then asked for a motion that Gale Lincke be elected director of District 3 by acclamation. Upon motion by Linda M. Anders, seconded by Norman F. Schultz, it was:

RESOLVED, That Gale Lincke be elected as director of District 3.

Attorney Woods stated that the District 4 meeting was held on May 7, 2024, and that Leo C. Henke was the only candidate nominated, and upon a voice vote, he received a unanimous vote of those present and voting and was thereupon declared to be the sole nominee for director of District 4. She then asked for a motion that Leo C. Henke be elected director of District 4 by acclamation. Upon motion by Craig Moreau, seconded by Harry J. Cull, it was:

RESOLVED, That Leo C. Henke be elected as director of District 4.

Attorney Woods then asked the newly elected directors to present a few brief remarks. Director Lincke and Director Henke each took turns thanking the membership for electing them.

President Lehmann returned to the podium and asked Tracy Denton to introduce the Scholarship and Youth Tour winners.

The 2024 Academic Scholarship winners, who will each receive a \$1,500 scholarship, and their parents were introduced to the audience as follows:

Next, Mrs. Denton went on to announce that a special drawing would be held that evening to award one \$1,500 scholarship to a graduate who did not receive a scholarship from the Cooperative's regular scholarship contest. This contest is called the "Luck of the Draw" Scholarship contest and was awarded to Teagan Branch.

Next, Mrs. Denton introduced the 2024 Government-in-Action Youth Tour participants who presented short speeches about their trip to Washington, D.C.

Rylynn Thumann, daughter of Casey Thumann and Jeremy Price; and Reagan Moreau, daughter of Jamie and Craig Moreau, spoke about their experiences on the trip and likely inspired other local youths to apply.

The President then returned to the podium and asked for a round of applause for both the scholarship and Youth Tour winners. He then stated that the Report of the Board and Management for the year 2023 would be presented in a videotaped message by the Cooperative's past General Manager, Gary Don Nietsche.

In the video update, Mr. Nietsche reviewed the history of the Cooperative's office spaces and buildings along with an overview of the new headquarters facility. Additionally, he discussed FEC's financials, system growth and improvements, and finally, the legacy of the Cooperative's leaders.

To round out his report, Mr. Nietsche recognized seven employees and the Cooperative's legal counsel who reached milestones in their careers: Lineman Joey Jasek, Apprentice Lineman Aaron Tonn and Staking Technician Brian Zbranek for 5 years of service; Legal Counsel Karen Mahoney Woods and Lineman Justin Whited for 10 years of service; Marketing & Training Coordinator Tracy Denton for 20 years of service; Line Foreman Greg Noak for 25 years of service; and Line Superintendent Robert Thomas for 35 years of service.

The President then returned to the podium and asked for a motion to accept the Report of the Board and Management for the year 2023. Upon motion by Linda M. Anders, seconded by Norman F. Schultz, it was:

RESOLVED, That the Report of the Board and Management for the year 2023 be accepted.

Next, the President announced that there would be another drawing for attendance door prizes. Directors Leo C. Henke and Gale Lincke drew the names of 20 door prize winners.
